Research reveals the best approach to teaching kids with LD to read. You'll be glad to know that, over the past 30 years, a great deal of research has been done to identify the most effective reading interventions for students with learning disabilities who struggle with word recognition and/or reading comprehension skills.

### **Effective Reading Interventions for Kids with Learning ...**

The following table identifies major categories of research-based practices for teaching Students with Disabilities (Column 1), including Universal Design for Learning (UDL), Response to Intervention (RtI), Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS), and Assistive Technology (AT), as well as research-based instructional practices for students with all levels of disabilities, as well as ELLs with disabilities.

### **Research-Based Practices for Teaching Students with ...**
